The principal **assigns** duties to the teachers.

Our class teacher **assigns (gives)** work to us

The president **assigns (gives)** responsibilities to the ministers.

Convey

I would like to **convey** my gratitude to you .

I would like to **give** my gratitude to you .

The secretary **conveys (gives)** his pleasure to the members.

Mr Ravi **conveys (gives)** his sympathy for Nimall's mother's death.

Handover –

I **handover** my report to the principal. (present)

I **give** my report to the principal. (present)

I **handed over** my report to the principal. (past)

I **gave** my report to the principal. (past)

Grade eleven students **handover** their book to the teacher.

The contractor **handover** the new building to the department.

Dedicate

We have to **dedicate** a lot to reach our target.

We have to **give** a lot to reach our target.

If you **dedicate (give)** a song you've written to a friend, it means the song belongs to them.

If the students **dedicate (give)** attention for the education they will get through the exams.

Offer life

Honest people **offer life** for their true love.

Honest people **give life** for their true love.

Some soldiers **offer (give)** their **lives** for the freedom of the country.

Some people **offer(give)** their **lives** in an unexpected moment and incidents.

Phrasal Verbs

Give up (Verb (give) + Preposition (up))

We can't **give up** our studies till we die.

WE can't **give up** treating the parents till our death.

(Stop doing some thing)

I have **given up** trying to help them.

She has **given up** thinking about her husband.

(Surrender , stop trying)

I can't think of the answer , I **give up**.

I **gave up** the climbing mountain , because I was very tired.

Give away

(Betray , report to authorities)

The gang **gave** him **away** to the police.

Nimal **gave away** his friend .

(Give without asking for a expecting payment.)

He decided to **give** his new album **away** in a magazine.

Give back

(Return something you've borrowed)

I **gave** the money **back** that she'd lent to me.

I **gave back** the film to her ,because it was not interesting.

(Return something that some has lost.)

Nothing could **give** me **back** the way I felt before the scandal.

Give in

(Stop doing something because it's too hard or requires too much energy.)

I couldn't finish the crossword puzzle and had to **give in** and look at the answers.

I couldn't answer the last question and had to **give in**

(Submit homework , etc)

The project has to be **given in** three weeks before we break up for the end of term.

Your answers must be **given in** today itself

(Surrender, accept defeat)

They **gave in** when the police surrounded the building.

I **gave in** ,due to my weaknesses .

Give out

(Distribute)

Somebody was **giving** leaflets **out** in front of the underground station.

Mr perera **gave out** the presents to the poor.

(Make public)

They **gave** the names of the winners **out** last night.

My name was **given out** in the 'daily mirror'

(Emit)

The factory **gives out** a lot of fumes.

Our old car sold because it **gave out** lot of smokes

(End or finish somewhere)

The path **gives out** halfway around the lake.

The road **gives out** near the post office

Give off

(Emit pollution or something else unpleasant)

The police stopped the van because it was **giving off** a lot black smoke.

(Expand)

The company is **giving off** all over the country.

The project will be **giving off** in the class room.

Give over

(Stop doing something bad or annoying)

They were making a lot of noise so I told them to **give over**

Please **give over** smoking.

(Entrust, pass on responsibility.)

We have **given** the premises **over** to the new company.

We have **given over** the duties for the new engineers.

(Stop an activity)

The police told the rioters to **give over**.

The teacher told the students to **give over**(stop)

My mother advised me to **give over** cigarettes.
